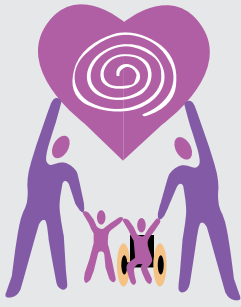
#### Ken Kulpa:

Chloe Kulpa is one of the nicest people I have ever met. She is always laughing and trying to make other people happy. Whenever I see her I always want to smile because that's what she does a lot. Chloe is 10 years old. She has a twelve year old brother, Logan who is also an extremely nice kid. Clearly their parents have taught them well. Even though they are separated, they still seem to have a lot of family time together for the kids. Chloe is the type of girl who doesn't really care what people think about the way she dresses or the way she likes to run through puddles in her nice shoes. Heck she wouldn't even care if people made fun of her for lying down in a puddle. But when I hear people making fun of her it makes me really sad and angry because she is my friend, and just because she has Downs Syndrome doesn't change her in my eyes at all.

One time, about two years ago, I was skateboarding with my best friend Noah who lives across the street from Chloe's house. We were coming to the end of the street when I heard a voice that I recognized but I couldn't tell exactly who it was. Once we got to the corner I saw Chloe's Brother Logan yelling down the street to some kids. I skated over to him as fast as I could to see what was happening and he told me briefly what was going on. There were four kids who were making fun of Logan for having a sister with Downs Syndrome. I was very mad that somebody would do that, I couldn't handle somebody making fun of her so for once I actually said something. I am not usually the type

Chloe Kulpa es una de las personas más agradables que he conocido. Ella siempre se esta sonriendo y trata de hacer feliz a otras personas. Siempre que la vea yo quiero sonreír porque eso es lo que ella hace siempre. Chloe tiene 10 años. Ella tiene un hermano de doce años de edad, Logan, que es también un niño muy agradable. Claramente sus padres los han enseñado bien. Aunque ellos están separados, ellos todavía pasan mucho tiempo juntos como familia por los niños. Chloe es el tipo de chica que no le importa realmente lo que otra gente piense de la manera que ella viste o la manera que ella quiere correr por los charcos en sus zapatos bonitos. A ella no le importa si las personas se burlan de ella por acostarse en un charco. Pero cuando oigo a personas que se burlan de ella me siento

of person that would go up to somebody I didn't know and tell them what to do or not to do, but I was furious. I skated to where the kids were and immediately got into their faces. I kept asking them if they thought that making fun of a person with a disability made them cooler but they never answered. They kept telling me that I was stupid for hanging out with Logan because of his sister having a disability. I wanted so badly to punch them in the face but I couldn't because then I would have gotten in trouble. I told them that Chloe is one of the nicest people in the world and she would never make fun of them for being different. I finally just walked off and told them that clearly she is a lot cooler than they are. They told me that they would beat me up with a baseball bat if I ever tried to hurt them. My plan wasn't to try to hurt them it was to try to scare them and make them feel bad enough so they would shut up.

Going up to those kids and doing what I did was very hard for me. I usually wouldn't do that because I just don't have the guts, this was different though. It was my friend's little sister that I really care about so I felt like I had to. I'll tell you, when I was walking over to the kids I never had a part of my body that told me to turn back. I also knew that my good buddy Noah was behind me and would come and back me up. After I talked to the kids I couldn't believe what I just did. I couldn't believe that I just stuck up for myself, not only for myself, but for one of my friends and his sister. I was very proud of what I had accomplished and will be for the rest of my life. I felt really bad for Logan because at the time he didn't have many friends and to hear kids saying bad things about your family members really hurts. I was also very proud of Logan and how he behaved. Sure he was mad, but he didn't express his anger that much. He explained that it wasn't Chloe's fault and that he loves her the same as anybody else loves their sister. I wasn't the only one being brave. Logan was really stepping his game up, and supporting his sister for who she was. I could tell that he loved his sister and nobody was going to say bad things about it. Personally I felt very disappointed in those kids because they thought they were really cool by putting somebody else down that has a special disability. I think it gave those kids a bad reputation in our neighborhood. In a way I am glad this incident happened because that gave me a major confidence boost and now I know that I should never hold back what I believe and always stick up for myself, my family, and my friends.

se burlara de ella y por primera vez dije realmente algo. Yo no soy generalmente el tipo de persona que enfrentaría a alguien para decirles que hacer o que no hacer, pero estaba furioso. Patiné hasta donde estaban los niños y me puse enfrente de sus caras. Les pregunté que si ellos pensaban que burlarse de una persona con una incapacidad los hacía mejores personas pero ellos nunca contestaron. Ellos solo me seguían diciendo que yo era un estúpido por juntarme con Logan porque su hermana tiene una incapacidad. Deseaba tanto darles unos puñetazos en la cara pero no pude porque entonces me metería en problemas. Yo les dije que Chloe es una de las personas más agradables en el mundo y que ella nunca se burlaría de ellos por ser diferentes. Por último me aleje de ellos y les dije que claramente ella era mejor persona que ellos. Ellos me dijeron que me pegarían con un bate de béisbol si algún día trataba de lastimarlos. Mi plan no era lastimarlos, solo quería tratar de espantarlos y hacerlos sentir lo suficiente mal para que se callaran.

Enfrentar a esos niños y hacer todo lo que hice fue muy duro para mí. Yo generalmente no haría esto porque no tengo el valor, pero esto fue diferente. Era la hermana pequeña de mi amigo y yo la apreció mucho así que sentí que tenía que hacerlo. Les diré, cuando caminaba hacia los niños yo nunca tuve una parte de mi cuerpo que dijera regrésate. Yo también sabía que mi mejor amigo Noah estaba detrás de mí y que el vendría apoyarme. Después de que hable con los niños yo no podía creer lo que acababa de hacer. Yo no podía creer que acababa de defenderme yo mismo, no sólo por mí, pero por uno de mis amigos y su hermana. Estoy muy orgulloso de lo que hice y lo estaré por el resto de mi vida. Me sentí realmente mal por Logan porque en aquel momento él no tenía muchos amigos y oír que otros niños dicen cosas malas acerca de algún miembro de tu familia realmente duele. También me sentí muy orgullo de Logan por la manera en que se comportó. Claro que él estaba enojado, pero él no expresó su ira. El explicó que no era la culpa de Chloe y que él la adora al igual que cualquiera adora a su propia hermana. Yo no era el único valiente. Logan realmente se mantuvo arriba del juego y supo apoyar a su hermana por quien ella es. Puedo decir que él adora a su hermana y nadie iba a decir cosas malas acerca de eso. Personalmente me sentí muy decepcionado de esos niños porque ellos pensaron que eran mejores por el hecho de ofender a alguien que tiene una incapacidad especial. Pienso que esto les dio una mala reputación a esos niños en nuestro vecindario. De cierta manera yo estoy contento que este incidente haya sucedido porque esto le dio un empuje a mi valentía y ahora se que nunca debo callarme lo que pienso y que debo defenderme a mí mismo, mi familia, y mis amigos.

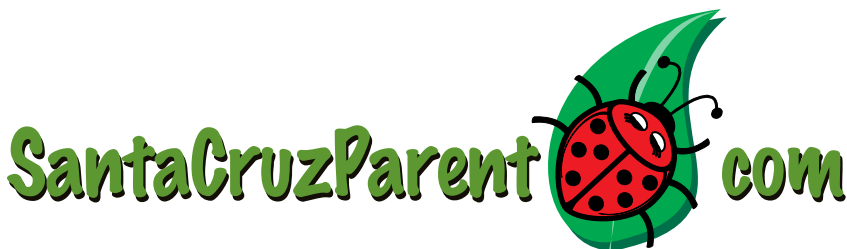

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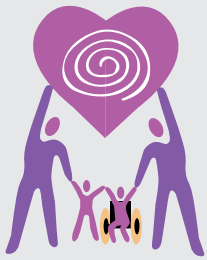
