

What is Assistive Technology (AT)?







What is Assistive Technology?

• **AT Device**:

Any item, piece of equipment, or product system, whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of a child with a disability. The term does not include a medical device that is surgically implanted, or the replacement of that device."[20 USC §1401(1)(2)34 C.F.R. 300.5].

• <u>AT Service</u>:

• any service that directly assists an individual with a disability in the selection, acquisition, or use of an assistive technology device. [20 USC §1401(1)(2)34 C.F.R. 300.6].

What is Assistive Technology?

AT Service:

- 1. Evaluation of the needs of such child, including a functional evaluation of the child in his or her customary environment;
- 2. Acquisition of AT
- 3. Selecting, designing, fitting, customizing, adapting, applying, maintaining, repairing, replacing
- 4. Coordinating therapies, interventions, or services with AT use
- 5. Training or technical assistance -> student
- 6. Training or technical assistance -> professionals, employers, or others



AT "assists" a student with:

- Reading and Writing
- Math
 - Communication
 - Computer Access
 - Study Skills

- Social Skills
- Organization and Planning
- Mobility
- Vision
- Hearing




















AT: High Tech Many Options in Many Areas

Extensions - web based programs that work through your browser. Typically requires you to create an account with the vendor to log in for use. It can add special functions and tools to your web-based browsing, word processor, presenting, organizing, planning, etc..



Apps or Applications -

tablet/phone/computer-based programs that perform specific functions and can be acquired through an App Store, Google Play, +

Software - refers to a program that is downloaded to a computer and runs off the hard drive. This technology is phasing out.



AT for Reading

Text to Speech (TTS) & Highlighting (single or dual)

 Reading aloud, paired with dual highlighting improves reading comprehension.





Ex: Use a system of notation on your notes to mark special/important aspects. Review notes within 48hrs. Transcribe notes into a study sheet. Abbreviations. Plan out regular review sessions (notes/book). Pomodoro method. Use a pen.

Effective consideration process to meet students needs for assistive technology





School Age Children

• **IDEA***. In developing each child's IEP, the IEP Team **must consider** whether the child needs assistive technology devices and **services**.

• Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973: Students on a 504 plan may also be entitled to AT as a reasonable accommodation.

*Individuals with Disabilities Education Act [§300.324(a)(2)]





Assistive Technology (AT) Consideration Flowchart (IEP)




Color Key Orange: Questions to ask. Blue: Possible outcomes. Purple: Action items.


Best Practices in Consideration Team Members Should:

- Have knowledge to make informed decisions
- Explore a continuum of devices/services
- Use a well-defined process to make decisions
- Base decisions on data and student's goals
- Document in the IEP the reasons to use or not use

"Consideration" vs. "Assessment"

• Consideration

- A short discussion
- Takes place during IEP meeting
- Uses known information
- Results in decision to not try AT, continue with same AT, try additional AT, or that more information is needed.

Assessment

- Extends from consideration
- 60 days
- Much more detail
- Looks closely at the students abilities, difficulties and the demands of the environments and tasks.
- Acquisition of new information

Common Errors



- AT is considered for those with severe disabilities only.
- No one on the team is knowledgeable regarding AT find a knowledgeable person to invite to the team
- Team does not use a *process* to collect data on the student functional need (ex. **s**tudent, **e**nvironment, **t**asks, **t**ool)
- Consideration of AT is limited to only those items that are familiar to team members.
